2035 Britain's electric future. Britain will ban the sale of new petrol, diesel and hybrid cars starting 2035, five years earlier than planned, in an attempt to reduce air pollution. "We have to deal with our CO2 emissions, and that is why the U.K. is calling for us to get to net zero as soon as possible, to get every country to announce credible targets to get there," said Prime Minister Boris Johnson.

According to Reuters, Britain's step amounts to a victory for electric cars that if copied globally could hit the wealth of oil producers, as well as transform the car industry and one of the icons of 20th Century capitalism: the automobile itself.

The mayors of Athens, Madrid, Mexico City and Paris have said they plan to ban diesel vehicles from city centres by 2025.

France is preparing to ban the sale of fossil fuel-powered cars by 2040 and

Norway's parliament has set a non-binding goal that by 2025 all cars should be zero emissions.
