All 22 suggestions were shared with you and eventually the top 3 names were selected for a vote at the last General Meeting. Once the choice for the new name (Squamish Seniors Society) was selected by the members, it was submitted to the Registrar for the BC Societies. However, we were told that they could not approve that particular name as it was not unique enough to distinguish our society from others. In a short Special General Meeting following the information session about the new Federal Government Dental Plan for Seniors on March 26, we will vote on the name that members chose second overall. A 2/3 vote of members in attendance in favour of the name change is required for the name to change. Of course, if the number of supporters is not there, there will be no name change. The new name being suggested is **Squamish 55+ Society**. The Dental Plan presentation begins at 4:00 pm, and our Special General Meeting begins at 5:30 pm - see you there!

General Meeting

February 24 was our first General Meeting and was well attended. We welcomed guest speakers, Keely Kidner from the District of Squamish who provided a brief summary of the Age-Friendly Community Grant; and Dr. Brenda J. Millar and Pip Parr, Hospice Nurse, who shared information about MAID (medical assistance in dying).

We also voted on the new name for the Society. If you recall, the membership selected 3 choices through an on-line survey: Squamish Seniors Society, Squamish 55+ Society, and Alive After 55 Society. After hearing from each of the individuals who submitted the names for consideration, the membership cast their votes and Squamish Seniors Society was passed.

Unfortunately, the BC government has rejected our application for the new name. As a result, we will be holding a Special General Meeting on March 26 to address this one item. The Agenda Package for the Special General Meeting was sent to all members March 12.
